1986 I worked full time at Bundaberg Base Hospital as a Principal House
Officer, continuing in similar roles in 1987 to 1989 part time.

March 1990 - May 1995 Director of Emergency at Griffith Base Hospital.
This was both a clinical and administrative post, which I developed further by
accepting medical students to the hospital and arranging their ongoing
supervision. Students from University of Sydney were accepted regularly,
recognised by the title of "Clinical Associate". International Students for
example from Germany were regular visitors and International Medical
Graduates were also accepted for clinical experience. Another part of my duties
was attending Hospital Board meetings.
